FMC (Food Machinery Corporation) was a significant builder of many of these cars. The 50' outside post, non-terminating end box car, became the foundation for new per diem cars built in the 1970's. The 50' FMC cars also varied in door configuration and style to better suit each customer. These models can still be seen today in the modern railroading scene.
